





Topics and Teaching

- ► We plan carefully for children's individual needs to ensure progression and support in specific areas.
- The mornings are set up to provide the children the opportunity to develop their skills in English, Maths and spellings.
- Guided Reading takes place daily as a whole class. On Mondays and Tuesdays we do activities all together and we split into groups for the remaining days. Every child will read in a small group with me on a weekly basis. There is a big focus on comprehension as well as word recognition.

Handwriting

- ► Children will be practising their handwriting daily.
- ► This will also provide opportunities for children to recap and consolidate their phonic and spelling knowledge.





Read Write Inc. Spelling


Read Write Inc. Spelling is a 15-minute-a-day programme for Years 2 to 6 (P3-P7).





- Reading in class Guided Reading, Whole Class Reading, Individual Reading and Paired reading.
- Use your child's diary to communicate messages e.g. changes to home time arrangements etc but please be aware that not every child will have their diary checked every day.





Please record your child's reading or encourage them to record it.

- Most children are also on coloured bookband books, please do listen to them read and support them at home.
- ▶ If children are inspired to read extra books of their choice please do encourage this, but they must also read their bookbag and bookband books.

Pathways to Write keys

Gateway keys (non-negotiables/basic skills)

- Use punctuation at Y2 standard correctly (full stops, capital letters -including for proper nouns, exclamation marks, question marks, commas in a list, apostrophes for contraction and singular noun possession)
- Use subordination (when, if, that, because) and coordination (or, and, but)
- Use present and past tenses consistently and correctly
- Use progressive forms of verbs
- Use expanded noun phrases
- Write sentences with different forms: statement, command, question, exclamation

► Mastery keys

(year group national curriculum expectations)


- Group related ideas into paragraphs
- Build a varied and rich vocabulary
- Use prepositions to express time, place and cause
- Introduce inverted commas to punctuate direct speech (one session)

Feature keys

(vocabulary, manipulating sentences and tense, structure)

- Write in the first person
- Use apostrophe in contractions
- Provide detail through use of prepositions to express time, place and cause
- Use a variety of sentence forms including statements and questions
- Write in consistent past and present tense including progressive forms
- Use some future tense verbs
- Use layout and structure of a letter
- Ensure chronological order to explain sequence of events





Rewards and Sanctions

- Our class follow the 'Good to be Green' behaviour system. Yellow and red cards are used for children who are breaking the Golden rules.
- Children get 20 minutes 'Golden time' on a Friday afternoon. Any child from Year 1 up to Year 6, who has had a yellow card will miss 5 minutes of Golden time. Any child who has had a red card will spend their Golden time with Mr Perry.
- Children are rewarded with a 'Good to be Green' certificate if they remain green throughout each term and a special badge if they have remained green all year.

Emotional Coaching

Emotion Coaching

We use Emotion Coaching to support children to understand, regulate and reflect on their behaviour. We advocate that our parents use this method too and regularly hold training and coffee mornings for parents to learn this approach and share their own experiences.

Steps of Emotion Coaching

Step 1

Recognising the child's feelings and empathising with them.

Step 2

Label the feelings and validating them

(validating = let the child know why they might be feeling like this and that this is okay)

Step 3

Set limits on the behaviour (if needed)

Step 4

Problem-solve with the child
